January 4, 2026 | Romans 8:31-39 | Brad

SUMMARY

Big Idea: Because God Perseveres, Christians will Persevere

In our verses, Paul draws chapter 8 to a close by leading us to draw conclusions about the truths he just laid out, in the whole chapter, but especially the preceding verses, v28-30. Those verses delivered to us the grand and glorious assurance of God completing all the steps necessary to bring about our salvation in the past, present and future. But are there any exception clauses? Paul answers in 31-39, "No!" Why? Because while the sin struggles within us and sufferings coming at us may tempt us to doubt, He has proven himself trustworthy to uphold his saving purposes - His character and disposition of grace toward us endures, His verdict of us being not guilty endures, and his love likewise endures. In each of these, Paul directs our attention to the cross, where God demonstrated clearly his grace, justice, and love.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Intro

Looking ahead to the new year, what are you excited about or hoping for?
What are you nervous or unsure about? What are you praying for?

Read Romans 8:31-32

1. God is "for us" and will "give us all things." How could these verses be misunderstood and misapplied? Where would these wrong understandings lead?
2. If that is not what Paul means, what does Paul mean, and how does the context of verses 28-30 help us?
3. In what situations or circumstances are you tempted to doubt God's character of grace toward you? Where does Paul direct our thoughts to combat those fears and doubts?

Read Romans 8:33-34

4. In what circumstance are you tempted to doubt God's justice - the justified status he has given you through Christ?
 - a. What makes Paul so certain that this status can never change?

Read Romans 8:35-39

5. In what circumstances are you tempted to doubt God's love for you?
 - a. What makes Paul fully convinced that nothing can separate us from God's love?
 - b. What does Paul mean when he says we are "more than conquerors?" How does it relate to 8:28-29?
6. What assurance do you have that you will endure and persevere to the end? What is the difference between an answer that begins with "Because I", versus the answer Paul desires for us to give, "Because He..."
